Faith Community Nurses (FCN) from our area attended the bi-monthly Networking & Coalition meeting held at the Palm Healthcare Pavilion & Mollie Wilmot Center and had an opportunity to tour the Visiting Nurses Association (VNA) 38 foot mobile health clinic aptly named the "Florence Nightingale Express." Equipped with waiting and exam rooms, it is staffed by a nurse practitioner and provides our local communities with access to multiple health services, such as medical screenings, flu clinics and other health-related services.

Faith Community Nurses regularly schedule the VNA to set up and administer flu shot and pneumonia clinics. Sandra Ferrin, Medical Services Rep, also encouraged calling the VNA to schedule health education topics throughout the year including MRSA, stroke prevention, cardiovascular health, and various vaccinations.
